Students who are enrolled in one or both summer sessions may opt to enroll in a payment plan for each corresponding session. A setup fee of \$15.00 per session will be due upon enrollment.

To Enroll in a Payment Plan:

1) Go to http://bannerweb.strose.edu

Students: Select Login to Secure Area, enter your ID and password, click the *Login* button, then select *Set up a Monthly Payment Plan*

Authorized Users: Select Login as an Authorized User, enter your ID and password,

click the Login Now button

- 2) Select the Payment Plans option at the very top of the screen
- 3) Select Sign up for a New Payment Plan, and choose the appropriate summer session
- 4) Select the available plan
- 5) Complete the Budget Worksheet to determine your plan amount OR, if you have a plan amount in mind, use the **Budget This Amount** line on the worksheet
- 6) Enter payment method -

(Note: Your payments will be automatically deducted on each scheduled payment date)**

- 7) Complete your enrollment agreement and pay the \$15.00 setup fee
- 8) If you are enrolling in a payment plan for each session, repeat these steps, starting at #2
